

Faith Christian Academy's "Report Card"

The Stanford Achievement Test is **the** objective measurement of how students and schools are performing in the United States. FCA students take the VERY SAME TEST as the one given to millions of other students around the country each spring. Again, FCA scores are more than excellent. The grade equivalents shown are median for each grade so for example, second grade scored 5.0. That means that the median student in our grade 2 scored the same as the median student in the fifth grade in the national sample.

"Post High School" (PHS) means that the median score in grades 9 and 10 compares with the median score of a student who has already completed high school (when measured by the U.S. national sample). Note: We do not "prep" our students for this test nor do we teach the test. Test day is the first time our students see the test.
