

# PEEPHOLE BOX

1. Take one shoe box.
2. Cut an oval hole in the top of the box and a peephole in the end of the box.
3. Cover the outside of the top and bottom with paper of your choice, leaving the holes open.
4. Put the name of your tribe and your name in bold letters on the top.
5. After deciding on the tribe you wish to portray, cover the sides and bottom of the inside of the box to show background scenery. Show details—clouds, birds, trees, bushes pictures on walls, houses, fire pits, etc.
6. Construct small characters and props out of construction paper. You may also purchase inexpensive plastic characters if you choose to do so.
7. Your box will be more exciting if your figures overlap when you look through the peephole. It creates a three-dimensional effect.
8. The example shown here is a court room scene that should be used as an example only. Remember you are showing an American Indian of North Carolina village.
9. You may use the pictures on pages 42-43, 44-45 and 46-47 to help you understand how your village should look. Remember that the Native Americans of North Carolina did not live in tepees, so you should not include these in your box!
