Weekly lessons will be given in the early afternoon and evening, Monday through Friday. Each semester will consist of 14 lessons.

Attendence Policy

Absences from lessons will be excused and a make-up lesson will be scheduled with no additional charge for the following:

- School cancellation
- Teacher absence
- Pre-notified conflict with a required WPS music ensemble event

Students are also entitled to one personal excused absence with 24-hour teacher notification. In these instances, the lesson will be made up with the teacher. Absences involving a major injury that affect the ability to play/sing or a prolonged illness will be handled on an individual basis with the teacher and Program Coordinator. The teachers are professionals and with advanced notice will try to accommodate student schedule changes as their schedule allows.
