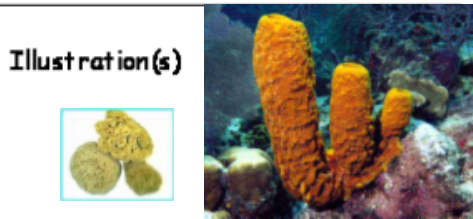


Group Name Sponges



Examples  
 Nearly 10,000 species of sponges exist

Habitat  
 Both salt water & fresh water

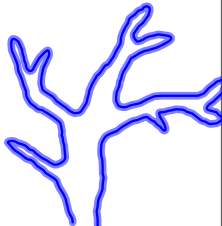
Food  
 filter food for plankton and other tiny organisms

Protection/ Body Structure  
 SIMPLE BODY use flagella to move water through body  
 spicules to keep rigid

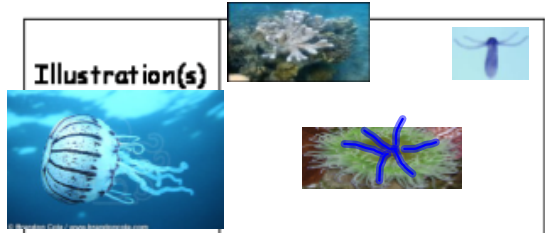
Reproduction  
 Asexually by "budding" or sexually with special cells

Other  
 Belong to phylum "porifera"

**SESSILE!** (they do not move)

 WATER  
 saltwater  
 hydra- fresh water

- Food
1. plankton
  2. fish
  3. clams

 Most have radial symmetry  
 tentacles with stinging cells

Reproduction  
 Asexually by "budding" or sexually with special cells

 MOST are SESSILE
