

12.1 vocabulary (4)

invertebrate-

an animal that has no backbone

sponge a simple multicellular invertebrate animal that stays attached to one spot and filters food from water

sessile The quality of being attached to one spot (opposite of mobile)

larva A free-living early form of a developing organism that is very different from its adult form

12.2 vocabulary (3)

cnidarian- an invertebrate animal, such as a jellyfish, that has a radially symmetrical body plan, tentacles w/stinging cells, and a central internal cavity

tentacle- a fingerlike extension used to hold, move, or touch

mobile- Able to move from place to place (opposite of sessile)
